A Few Notes: Please review and share relevant info. with students and parents:

- More Than Picking Pumpkins: In addition to picking pumpkins, students will have the opportunity to learn about the gardens, animals and history of the farm on a self-guided tour aided by volunteer education docents.
- Arrival and Departure: Plan on arriving at and departing from the farm no later than your scheduled time. This is important to insure

- that other groups after yours have an opportunity to experience the farm as well.
- Appropriate Clothing: Close-toed shoes, socks, and blue jeans are
 the best way to avoid unpleasant encounters with cockleburs. Also, we
 will be outside the entire time, so students should be prepared for the
 ever-changing Colorado weather. This should include hats on sunny
 days. PLEASE ALSO REMEMBER TO BRING WATER BOTTLES AS
 WATER WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR VISITORS.
- Group Size & Child/Parent Ratio: 12-15 students maximum, with 3-4 adults is ideal. Breaking up larger groups will help move groups more smoothly through stations.
- Nametags: All students should wear nametags with first and last name, school, and teacher on the off-chance that they get lost on the farm.
- Parking: Busses and cars will be parked in separate areas. All
 vehicles will enter through St. Dominic's Church main entrance.
 You will be directed to the appropriate parking area when you arrive.
- **Rain**: Due to the large number of students scheduled to come, your time is good rain, sun or snow. Unfortunately we will not be able to reschedule if you are unable to attend.
- Plastic Bags: Reusable cloth bags, backpacks or simply using your hands are the best way to carry pumpkins. Every year we pick up hundreds of plastic bags and pieces of plastic bags. These are a problem for the environment as well. Please use this as a teachable moment and encourage parents and kids to use more environmentally friendly alternatives to plastic bags.
- Nick's Rule: In order for all children to have the thrill of picking their own pumpkin Nick asked that all students carry out their own pumpkin from the field.
- Additional Pumpkins: While each student receives a complimentary pumpkin, a Pumpkin Stand selling additional pumpkins, may be open on the day of your visit if at all possible. Cash or Checks accepted.
- *Camera*: Be sure to bring a camera to snap a photo of your class next to the Venetucci wagon!
- Respect: Please be respectful and careful of the plants and animals, pick up your trash and be thankful for the opportunity to visit this farm thanks to the generosity of the Venetuccis, as well as all of the hard working farm staff that grow the vegetables and take care of the animals.
