In 2025, Pikes Peak Community Foundation focused on improving lives in the Pikes Peak region by supporting important work on the issues and priorities that matter most to our residents.

We hope that you'll be inspired by the stories we'll share. The Board of Trustees remains committed to stewardship of the resources entrusted to us, including making sure they are used in the most effective and efficient way to benefit our community. At the same time, we refined our internal processes, including how we issue discretionary grants, to be more transparent, responsive, and aligned with community need.

We also advanced Our Spacious Skies, a community-driven effort to better understand the priorities and values of people across the Pikes Peak Region. We began with an extensive process that included individual interviews, focus groups held in El Paso and Teller Counties, and an intense week-long session for more than 60 people. That work informed a scientific study and a complementary community survey through which thousands of residents shared their perspectives, creating a valuable foundation for our work ahead. We are focused on putting this insight into action by aligning our grantmaking and building partnerships to address what matters most to our community.

We are excited to build on our momentum.

IMPACT STORY



Flying Pig Farm in Manitou Springs is a community learning garden that helps people build resilient relationships with food and natural systems through hands on, land-based learning, shared meals, workshops, and seasonal gatherings. In 2025, PPCF grantmaking supported their work alongside other local awardees making an impact across the region.

Grant dollars helped Flying Pig improve their yurt, giving them a stronger, more welcoming space to host students and community groups. The farm shared that the yurt updates would absolutely transform the space, strengthening its ability to teach, convene, and serve its mission year-round.

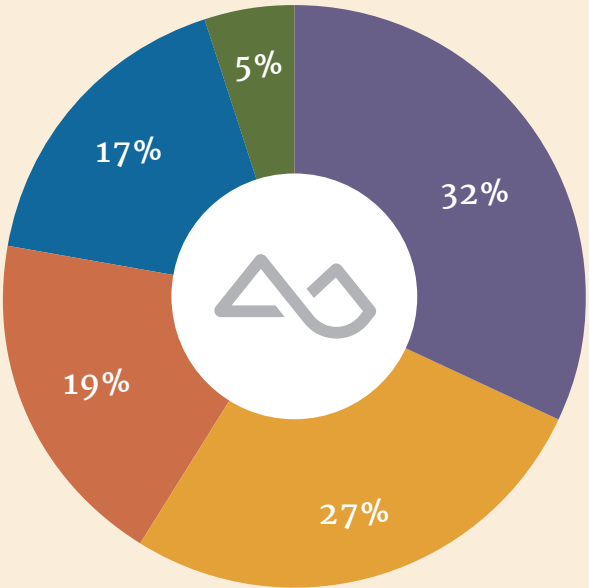

GRANTMAKING CELEBRATION



PPCF refreshed its grantmaking process in 2025 to create a more open and accessible experience for nonprofits across the region. Applications were expanded to include our Community Impact Funds and select Field of Interest Funds, welcoming any eligible nonprofit organization to apply. We also offered new resources like webinars and downloadable templates to support and strengthen nonprofit fundraising efforts. Our discretionary grants were awarded through a competitive review led by PPCF staff and skilled volunteer advisory councils. The process was informed by a comprehensive evaluation framework that considered data, alignment with our mission, and emerging insights from Our Spacious Skies. More than 100 people attended our celebration honoring the grantees in downtown Colorado Springs.

EMPOWERED VOICES CREATE STRONGER COMMUNITIES

Our Spacious Skies, PPCF's regional visioning initiative, moved from concept to action in 2025 engaging almost four thousand residents across El Paso and Teller Counties.

We are grateful to the 30-member steering committee representing diverse sectors and perspectives. It was co-chaired by Joe Aldaz, President and CEO of the Colorado Springs Hispanic Business Council; Pastor Ben Anderson, Executive Director of Solid Rock Community Development Corporation; Jan Martin, President of Garden of the Gods Foundation and Pikes Peak Waterways; and former Colorado Springs Mayor John Suthers. More than 50 community partner organizations expanded outreach, hosted conversations, and encouraged participation across the region.

The year focused on listening and building a strong framework for community input, ensuring the effort reached into diverse neighborhoods, organizations, and networks. By combining community voices with statistically valid research, the process created a credible and representative understanding of regional priorities.

The work now shifts to activation. PPCF is working extensively across sectors to facilitate use of the data by organizations on the front lines making a difference on the identified priorities. Organizations include government, business, philanthropy, tourism, sports, arts and culture, parks and open space, and community development. All are using the findings to inform and facilitate planning, investment, and decision-making.

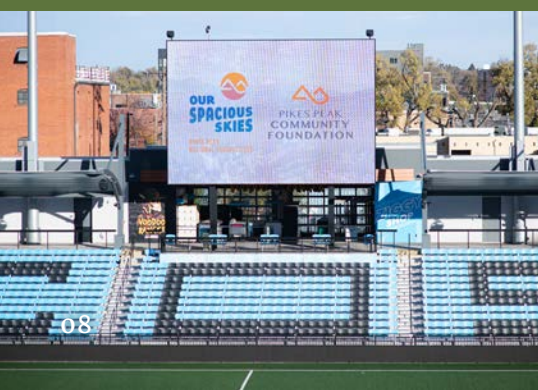
